Today, we interview Darren Drake, member of and keyboardist for the well-known band, Killer Flamingos (killerflamingos.com). The band covers 'Top 40 across the decades, from the 80's to current hits, with some Motown and other familiar favorites sprinkled in. Their considerable versatility, combined with off-the-chart levels of crowd interaction has kept the Flamingos at the top of fan voted lists like Hour Detroit Magazine's "Best Band" and WDIV's Click On Detroit's "Best Local Band" for numerous years since 2008. They recently received the Metro Times "Best Cover Band" distinction and Hour Detroit's "Best of Detroit" mention.'

So you grew up here in Troy? I'm an Athens alumni (1987) and I got my Bachelor of Arts in Public Relations from Wayne State University in 1993. Then I joined the Killer Flamingos Band in 1994, so I never had to get a "Day Job." I stay up late and like to sleep in so it worked out perfectly!

So you now do public relations through music? Yeah, something like that.

Do you have any family here?

I have a sister, Renee, and a brother, Frank. They both attended Troy Athens High School as well. However, they were much older than me and I felt more like an only child at times.



Recently, unexpectedly, we lost drummer and beloved member, Tim Webber in 2023. The band's newest member is the talented drummer Jeff Supina.

So you are the only original member of band? Yeah, but we've never been better than we are today. We're all multi-talented musicians and vocalists. The Flamingos have a wide range of music to choose from. We're not a weekend bar band, rather a group of seasoned professionals.
